Particularly, the authors enjoyed presenting a copy of the book to the students of St Patrick's School and the Allora State School. Both had attended the school. Tom's mother had been a first day pupil of he St Patrick's School when it was opened in 1916; his sister Betty and, in addition to himself, his three brothers Pat, Kev and Drew received their education there and similarly three of his own children had attended the school for some years. Tom pointed out the tree he had planted in the grounds in 1982 when he was the Federal Minister for the Environment as part of the National Tree Programme which he had negotiated for \$5 million through the Federal Parliament. Indicative of my pride in St Patricks, this tree was the first tree planted in the whole of Australia – and it was here.

From this Friday, Queenslanders will be out in force selling merchandise in preparation for Pink Ribbon Day, Monday 28

Pink Ribbon Day is an annual Cancer Council fundraiser supporting the 1 in 8 Queensland women who will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime.

In South West Queensland, around 217 women are diagnosed with breast cancer each year, and about 37 die from the disease. It is the most common cancer diagnosed in Queensland women, and the second biggest cancer killer.

It might seem like a small gesture to buy a pink ribbon, key ring, bracelet, water bottle, t-shirt (or even a pair of I Heart Pink gym socks!) but every dollar raised makes a great difference to Queenslanders impacted by breast cancer.

Having successfully shot short film Rain in Thargomindah in 2012 the team are set to create their fourth sci-fi film in late November, 2013.

However, time travel is never that easy and soon Linden is caught in the suffocating web of time paradoxes. Can he break the cycle and save his wife?

The director and Crew attended Cannes Film Festival in May 2013 to view the premiere screening of their film Rain and won Best short Film at the Pittsburgh Independent Film Festival before screening at Hollyshorts LA, and in the National category of Canberra Independent Film Festival.

Now is the perfect time to become storm ready

October 2013: The weather bureau is forecasting an average cyclone season for Australia and suggests Queenslanders can expect four cyclones to form and one to cross the coast. UnitingCare Community doesn't want people to feel complacent in a period of relative calm before the next season of heat waves, storms, rain and bushfires. Our counterparts down in NSW are currently battling against devastating bushfires and UnitingCare Community is urging people to use this time to prepare themselves for any potentially threatening events that could significantly affect their lives.

"During the lead up to storm and fire season is the perfect opportunity to make sure we are all prepared for what follows and going on what happened with Ex Tropical Cyclone Oswald at the start of 2013 we now know that mother nature can be very unpredictable at times," said Jonathan Antao, Community Recovery State Manager.

The Community Recovery work of Lifeline, one of the core services provided by UnitingCare Community, has been supporting communities throughout Queensland for well over 50 years. In that time, we have discovered that what helps people most in minimising the emotional and psychological impact of disaster events is how well the person was prepared for the disruption to their lives.

"We can all do our bit to feel prepared and the first step in preparation for disasters is to note down some important numbers and keep them on hand," said Mr Antao.

"Time and again Lifeline Crisis Support Officers and Counsellors have helped to stabilise people affected by a disaster, and time and again they have noticed that those who are best able to cope are those who have foreseen the possible affects a disaster event could have on their lives," said Mr Antao.

One of the most difficult experiences for a person impacted by a disaster event can be a loss of control. Everyday things that they believed to have mastery over suddenly seem beyond them which can result in them feeling paralyzed and can compound their experience of helplessness.

"When people feel like they have lost control of their lives, their capacity to plan and problem solve is diminished. This is when Lifeline Crisis Support Officers have such a vital role to play. They help to stabilize the person and regain a sense of control. The person can then start to work out what steps they need to make to begin their recovery," said Mr Antao.

Although people may still experience damage to their homes, loss of valued possessions and major disruptions to their lives, when they have taken even the smallest of steps to plan for such events, their feelings of loss of control are significantly reduced. Lifeline Crisis Support Officers know this all too well and are preparing for the summer season themselves.

Simply knowing who to call for help is empowering and helps a person start the journey of recovery. A few key numbers to have handy are:



Google launches bushfire map for Queensland residents

Google has launched a dedicated Crisis Map for Australia that shows current bushfire activity in Queensland, as well as other need-to-know information.

With information sourced directly from Queensland Rural Fire and other fire authorities across the country, the Google Crisis Map lets the public see the location, size and status of any bushfire threats. It also displays which local emergency agency is responding, and any associated road closures or traffic incidents

"The web is the first port of call for many Aussies when fire hits. Last bushfire season we saw a five-fold spike in Google searches as people went online to find out where fires were burning and how to stay safe," said Nigel Snoad, Product Manager for Google Crisis Response.

"As summer approaches, the need for reliable and easily accessible information is more important than ever, particularly in regional parts of the state.

"During emergency responses to fires, authorities will be able to add useful information to the map including shelter locations, evacuation areas and where to find vital services".

The map is available on all devices via google.org/crisismap/ australia and can be embedded on all web sites.

The Google Crisis Map is also available for bushfire information in NSW, SA, TAS and the ACT.



Council helps communities with emergency preparedness - Note: change of date for training in Allora

A great many lessons were learned during the 2010/11 and 2013 floods and these are being passed on in the form of training for emergency response volunteers.

Southern Downs Regional Council Volunteer Co-ordinator Bette Bonney said Council supported the training sessions to help local communities feel confident to respond in an

"We all hope that the extreme weather events of the past few years won't happen again however we do need to have a sense of readiness if they do. Recent unseasonal flash storms (eg Pratten) and warnings raises further the need for skilled local spontaneous volunteers.

"There are enormous skills and talents within our Southern Downs communities and if we can gather these volunteers to provide some training we will certainly have a strong foundation on which to build our counter disaster strategies," she said.

SDRC Community Services Manager Ms Sheila Stebbings said she was pleased the training co-incided the State Government's "Get Ready" campaign which asks all QLD residents to prepare for the storm season, extreme weather and natural disasters.

"Council is committed to continued support of residents in the lead-up to and throughout the summer season," she said.

Mrs Bonney, who co-ordinated over 200 volunteers during the 2010/11 floods, said she had held training at Stanthorpe in early August and the feedback had been very positive.

"We discuss a number of topics including responsibilities of a volunteer, essential communication skills, working in a team, basic support skills, basic risk management and self care.

"We also look at duties during and after a disaster and the logistics of co-ordinating people and resources to best effect. Further training sessions are as follows:

- · WARWICK CWA HALL: TUESDAY OCTOBER 29th: 9AM - 1.30PM (morning tea & lunch) RSVP Friday Oct 25th. THURSDAY OCTOBER 31st: 6PM - 9.00 PM (light tea & supper) RSVP Monday Oct 30th.
- · ALLORA Allora RSL Hall (please note: this date was in October and has been changed to November): MONDAY NOVEMBER 11th: 6PM - 9PM (light tea & supper) RSVP Thursday Nov 7th.

"We are looking at dates and venues for Killarney sessions as well and we will advise as soon as possible.

"We hope as many people as possible will take up the training. Working as a team is an essential part of emergency response and we are already seeing that with people getting to know each other at the training sessions," she said.

He said motorists should check the following before setting off:

- · Ensure your car is serviced and key maintenance checks have been completed (RACQ Fact Sheets)
- Check your motor vehicle, home contents and travel insurance policies to ensure that you're adequately covered (RACQ Insurance)
- · If you need to update your driving or towing skills, book an RACQ driver refresher or caravan towing course (RACQ Driver Training)
- · Plan your journey to include 15-minute rest stops every two hours (RACQ Trip Planner)
- · Check for road closures or flooding along your chosen route (RACQ Road Conditions) and alter the route if necessary (If it's flooded, forget it).

Mr Spalding said it was essential to take a car that was safe and suitable for the conditions you would encounter on the trip. "If you are buying a new car especially for the trip, have it checked by our Vehicle Inspections team before you buy so that you don't end up with a lemon," he said.

Mr Spalding said those planning to stay at home over the summer holidays should also prepare for storms or other

"In addition to checking that you're adequately covered and up to date with your insurance policies, there are some steps you can take to protect yourself and your car if a storm is approaching."

- If a storm is forecast, park your vehicle under cover if possible and delay your trip or use alternative modes of transport
- · If a storm breaks, seek safe shelter while taking care not to put others at risk and be considerate of property owners' rights
- · Don't park or shelter under trees
- Don't speed up to beat a storm instead seek a safe place to shelter until the storm passes
- · Turn on your headlights to increase visibility
- · If caught in a storm and visibility is reduced, pull off the road to avoid being hit by traffic and turn your hazard lights on
- · Don't drive through flood waters even shallow flowing water can sweep vehicles away
- Don't park in areas that have flooded in the past
- · If your home or yard is prone to flooding, organise a safe alternative parking spot for your car.

Be vigilant around waterways

As figures show 34% of all fatal drownings last year were in regional Australia. Royal Life Saving warns people in the Allora area to be vigilant when they are around all waterways.

Inland waterways – mainly found in rural and remote Australia - continue to account for the largest number of drowning deaths. In the past 12 months 99 people drowned in inland waterways. In the past year 291 people have drowned in Australian waterways.

People across regional Australia are being warned by Royal Life Saving to be very careful when they are in or around water following the release of the Royal Life Saving National Drowning Report 2013.

The report reveals 34% of all drownings last year were in regional and remote Australia.

Royal Life Saving CEO Justin Scarr says it is critical people in the Allora area are vigilant when they are around all waterways.

Inland waterways - many in rural and remote areas of Australia - now account for the largest number of drowning deaths ... claiming the lives of 99 Australians in the past 12 months.

291 Australians drowned in the past year. There has been a steep and disturbing increase in drowning in people aged 55 and over. Justin Scarr says the figures show we can all do much more to prevent tragedies from happening.

The new National Drowning Report 2013 has just been launched by Royal Life Saving. The Federal Minister for Health and Minister for Sport, the Hon

Peter Dutton MP, officially launched the report. The message is that we must all help to try and reduce drownings.

Justin Scarr said, "The Coalition Government's commitment of additional funding to target drowning in inland waterways will save lives. Royal Life Saving will work to identify the top ten river drowning locations across Australia and work with communities to reduce drowning".

A staggering 82% of all drowning deaths are all males. Royal Life Saving warns people must stay safe when fishing and boating

Justin Scarr said, "Men absolutely must stop and think before taking unnecessary risks when they are swimming, fishing, or boating with their fathers, brothers or mates. We need to see less alcohol. greater use of personal floatation devices and more caution when the weather is changing."

The concerning new Report also reveals there's been a 48% increase in the number of children aged 0-4 drowning. 31 young

lives were lost last year in pools, dams and bathtubs. 61% of the deaths were in swimming pools. In half the cases children accessed an unfenced pool or got into the pool area by a faulty or propped open gate. Royal Life Saving says the message "Keep Watch" has never been more relevant.

Justin Scarr said, "We need pool owners to realise pools can be extremely dangerous to young children. It is not a matter of simply shutting a gate. With a fully compliant pool fence, the type that many State Governments have legislated for recently, the gate shuts itself. Self-closing, self-latching, four sided fencing to isolate the pool and keep kids out is vital and must be regularly maintained."

Royal Life Saving says a lack of adult supervision is still the number one issue in child drowning. Falls into water accounted for 81% of all drowning deaths in the under 5 age group. Royal Life Saving says many of the drowning incidents occur when adults are distracted attending to other children, watching TV, performing daily chores or mistakenly think someone else is supervising the child. Royal Life Saving points out child drowning rarely happens during barbeques or parties. The organisation says you have to keep watch at all times to prevent children from drowning.

"We want to see drowning halved by 2020. There is much to do. Pool owners have to realise pools are extremely dangerous. It is not a matter of simply shutting a gate. With a fully compliant pool fence, the type that many State

Justin Scarr added, "The number of people drowning in inland waterways is very concerning. Many of these deaths sadly happen in regional or remote areas of Australia. These areas are often isolated and a long way from help in an emergency. The high number of inland drowning deaths has prompted an urgent focus on identifying and then acting on inland drowning black spots in communities across the country."

Royal Life Saving says it's vital people arm themselves with information about how to prevent drowning - highlighting that all drowning incidents are preventable.


