

Rotary New faces and new logo in Rotary Changeover

Under a new logo introduced internationally, the Rotary Club of Allora celebrated the induction of a new board to the club, with the new president, Andrew Westerman and two of the newest members, Robyn Draper and Liz Marshall, taking up roles as Treasurer and Secretary respectively. The board also includes Roy Smith in Membership, Graham Hoey, the Rotary Foundation, Public Relations with Norm Tranberg, Youth - Andrew Westerman, John Gordon to continue as Sergeant-at-Arms and Club Administration with Bill Lester.

Bill Lester chaired the change-over. Past District Governor David Lee, of the Rotary Club of Stanthorpe, deputised for outgoing District Governor Tony Heading. David has a long association with the Allora Club and his words of support were most welcome. We were reminded by Jack Gordon of the most valuable work of Rotary in both the local community and on an international level, especially in the eradication of Polio. Norm Tranberg stood in for Ann Balmain, who is currently overseas, to deliver her report on her period of presidency and the activities that Rotary has undertaken locally. This past year, many local clubs and organisations have been the beneficiaries of Rotary donations of money and time.

Andrew Westerman thanked Ann for her work over the past year and outlined the directions for the club in the next year under the theme of "Lighting Up Rotary". He mentioned the need for continuing new membership and, to that end, foreshadowed an initiative for the club which will be titled Friends of Rotary - a way to involve non-Rotarians who support community service to become involved without the cost of membership and commitment to every meeting. Details of this initiative will be discussed in future club meetings with a launch later this year.

Additionally, Andrew hopes to work towards forming an Interact Club at Allora State School as the core of a Interact Club of Allora, which welcomes members from any school and members of school age.

Roy Smith toasted the work of kindred clubs in community, in particular the work of our local Scope Club.

The evening was well attended, with Rotary representatives from Beaudesert, Boonah, Fassifern Valley, Stanthorpe and Warwick. As always, a sumptuous meal was provided by the Railway Hotel.

Looking Back...

When is a Town a "Town"?

The town of Allora reached two significant milestones this month. It is 155 years since surveyor George Pratten completed the survey of the town on the 1st July 1859 and 145 years since the town was constituted a municipality on the 21st July 1869.

It must be remembered that we are talking European settlement history. Human feet had trodden the creek flats on which the town was built for thousands of years before the European settlers arrived. The fact that they were bare aboriginal feet rather than booted European ones does not reduce their importance.

Was Allora a "town" from the minute that the last white peg was driven into the ground to complete the task of marking out allotments and streets? Does the fact that there were no houses on the allotments or people in houses make any difference?

The site of the town was occupied by European settlers before 1859. By that time blacksmith William Jubb and his wife had long moved on to the Woolpack Inn at Cunningham's Gap, having been on the site of the future town in the mid 1840's. George Pratten's original survey map records the "Remains of Jubb's Inn". Neil Ross and his family had moved on from their home which was situated on what is now the northern end of the golf course. Andrew Hanselman was supposed to have lived in a shepherd's hut on the future site of the town but this is not recorded on the survey map. Samuel Gordon and family did live in another shepherd's hut on the side of Allora Mountain but this was on Goomburra Station and outside the town boundary. Was Allora a "town" when the first people took up official residence? If that is the case then it was a "town" from the 5th March 1860 when the first land sale took place. Apart from the inevitable speculators, successful purchasers could have camped on their newly acquired land the next day. Some may have been camped on the site prior to

the sale in anticipation of making a purchase.

Allora was certainly a "town" before it was constituted a municipality on the 21st July 1869. It had several hundred residents, at least two general stores, three hotels, butcher's shop, blacksmith's shop and other tradesmen, school, post office and police station by that time.

The formation of the Municipal Council would have brought some order to the town. The clearing and formation of the streets, the control of waste disposal and the controlling of straying animals would have been some of the problems confronting the newly elected council. The make up of the first Allora Municipal Council probably reflected the settlement pattern of the area. All six of the new aldermen would eventually become landholders to a greater or lesser degree, but at the time of the election the first mayor, Francis Kates, was a German born, university educated, storekeeper. John Gallagher, Alexander Shannon and Samuel Gordon were from the north of Ireland, the first two being farmers and Samuel Gordon, the proprietor of the Princess of Wales Hotel. Patrick O'Callaghan was from southern Ireland and was a farmer whose family would later own Tattersalls Hotel and the Railway Hotel. Isaac Hardwick was from England and was a blacksmith at the time of his election in 1869.

The aldermen of the Allora Municipal Council served the people of Allora until 1915. The council had received a boost in 1879 when the 20,000 acres of the Allora Exchange Lands were added to its area of responsibility. In 1915 the Allora Shire

was formed taking in the former Allora Municipality and land in the Goomburra, Glengallan and Talgai districts which was previously part of the Clifton Shire. The Allora Shire ceased to exist in 1994 when the Shire, along with the former Glengallan and Rosenthal Shires, was amalgamated by the State Government into the Warwick Shire. It is interesting to note that it was not until the mid 1980's, some 115 years after the formation of local government in Allora, that a woman was elected to the council. Councillors Sue Cowley and Ding Atkinson served until 1994, Cr. Cowley going on to serve as Allora representative in the Warwick Shire Council. The area is now administered by the Southern Downs Regional Council.







Wattles Win as Eagles Fall from Grace

The 'National Farmer's Warehouse' Wattles 'A' Grade Warriors further consolidated their hold on the top rung of the 2014 'Hutchies Cup' Toowoomba Rugby League premiership ladder with a dominant 42 - 14 victory over the Highfields 'Eagles' at the Kuhl's Road

Recreation Complex on Sunday. The 'Warriors' relentless march to the TRL finals series is picking up pace, with just three fixtures remaining before the first semi-final weekend on August 16th & 17th.

While Wattles President Aaron Scheid is stoked with the performances of the A graders, with 14 wins from 15 outings this season, including six wins from six starts in the second half of the season, "it is vital that we keep focused on our goals and don't get carried away without success." Aside from the pressures of being Wattles head administrator, Scheid has firsthand knowledge of the onfield challenges his club is dealing with as a member of the high flying first grade team, the tough lock forward rated one of the best in green & gold against the 'Eagles'.

"While the recent acquisition of the 2014 TRL minor Premiership is a tremendous addition to our trophy cabinet" said Scheid, "our goal is to be hoisting the silverware at Clive Berghofer Stadium on September 7th and celebrating Wattles third first grade premiership".

The Wattles President quick to say though, "it's one match at a time to get there."

Coach Luke Duggan felt Highfields presented a tough challenge, "I thought we played 'fair', we are still working on different parts of our game that I think we need improvement."

Wattles backs were more than a handful for Highfields, scoring six of the 'Warriors' eight touchdowns, youngster on the rise Garth Lonergan snatching two tries as did centre Joel Koina. Front-rower Pat Manley was in exceptional form, as was 'oh so consistent' halfback Matt Duggan, while outside back Dale McAntee continues to impress in top company.

While the 'Eagles', coached by former Wattles mentor Dan Sparksman, drew first blood on the scoreboard when their skipper Eugene Seddon crossed after seven minutes, their control over the game was short-lived with Conor Swinton levelling the score at 6 all minutes later.

While the 'Eagles' kept in touch for much of the first half, further tries by the Koina brothers Joel (2) and Mitch saw Wattles ease in to half time leading 22 - 10.

After a season dogged by injury, it was great to have the input of class forward Mitch Koina back in the line up, especially with Wattles down a few regulars for the journey to Kuhl's Road. Koina has been out since the Madsen-Rasmussen Trophy final against Gatton in early June but has re-emerged as the business end of the season looms. Koina added a try to Wattles total in the closing minutes of the first half, capitalising on some solid lead up work by Joel Koina & Michael Bermingham.

Wattles were back in the point's minutes into the new stanza, winger Garth Lonergan cruising into the corner to score after a Matt Duggan break, and after fullback Jackson Green was hauled down just short of the try line in desperate defence.

Former Wattles winger Brandan Cubby added a try to the 'Eagles' total, the home side trailing 14 - 28 after 56 minutes.

Matt Duggan touched down beside the uprights after Wattles had given the ball plenty of air through many hands, to lead 34 - 14.

The final five minutes saw Wattles drive the final nails home in a comprehensive win, Joel Koina sending Lonergan down the touch line for his second try. Koina also featured in the lead up, along with centre Mark Duggan and winger Dale McAntee that eventually saw Duggan score ten

SDRC encourages local men to think about health
