





Way forward mapped out for Allora-Clifton Rd culverts

A way forward has been mapped out for heavy vehicles using the Allora-Clifton Road, with a temporary detour route around existing culverts to be provided, while repairs are undertaken

At its General Meeting last week, Southern Downs Regional Council adopted four recommendations aimed at addressing concerns over the poor condition of culverts on Allora-Clifton Road, and potential impacts on transport companies and some farmers if load limits were applied to the existing culverts.

The condition of the culverts was identified following investigations brought about by a B Double application submitted last year, and subsequently rejected because of concerns over the culverts. Following a review of that decision, the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator rejected the application, due to the inadequacy of the Allora Drive culverts.

Further inspections were instigated by Council through the Department of Transport and Main Roads and specialised structural Engineers, Instrada, resulting in a recommendation that load limits be applied to the existing culverts on Allora-Clifton Road, sparking concerns about the flow-on impacts to transport companies and local farmers.

At its General Meeting on 16 March 2016. Council resolved to obtain further recommendations from Instrada about how to solve the issues with the culverts and load limits.

Southern Downs Regional Council's Director Engineering, Peter See, said Council's Engineering Department commissioned a report by Instrada seeking solutions to the problems with the existing culverts with the objective to remove

"Instrada's report recommended that the existing culverts be repaired at a cost of about \$45,000, and this action would extend the life of the culverts by up to 15 years, subject to regular inspection.

"Council will progress repairs to the existing culverts, but more immediately, will prepare an alternative route for heavy vehicles around the culverts on Allora-Clifton Road. This will come at a cost of about \$15,000, and the combined cost of works will be funded from the existing roads maintenance budget.

"While these works are underway, a load limit will have to be applied to these culverts, and will be removed when the repair works are completed," he said.

Mayor Dobie said this outcome was a good compromise to minimise the impacts on the heavy vehicle users of Allora-Clifton Road, but pointed out this was a separate matter to the B Double application and the issue of the Allora Drive and Allora Clifton Road intersection.

Locations prioritised for Round 2 Mobile Black Spot funding

At the first General Meeting of its new term, Southern Downs Regional Council noted a report about 15 locations in the region prioritised for funding in a submission to Round 2 of the Mobile Black Spot Program.

The submission was made following a request in December 2015 from the Queensland Department of Science, Information Technology and Innovation to identify locations where funding from the Mobile Black Spot Program could be used to improve mobile phone services.

Southern Downs Regional Council's Mayor, Cr Tracy Dobie said the request to identify such locations was distributed

"The Department sought the identification of locations, not only from councils, but from businesses, citizens and communities across Queensland, resulting in 1793 locations being identified across the state, with 51 of those in the Southern Downs region," she said.

The Mobile Black Spot Program is aimed at regional and remote areas only, and urban areas, such as Stanthorpe and Warwick are specifically excluded. The eligibility and viability of locations is based on strict criteria: the number of tourists passing through the area (i.e. external traffic); and the number of dwellings or accommodation outlets in the area.

The Mayor highlighted that the following 15 locations had been prioritised by Council's Information Technology and Economic Development officers based on the criteria and in consultation with the Warwick and Stanthorpe Chambers of Commerce and tourism businesses based outside of the urban areas.

- 3. The Summit 4. Ballandean
- 5. Glen Aplin

Council approves the draft 2016-2017 **Budget and seeks community** feedback

Over the past six months Council officers have been working on the draft 2016-2017 Budget for the new Council. The draft has been presented to the new Council as part of the induction process, and it will now be placed on exhibition for 28 days to seek feedback and comment from the community.

This is the first year in which the draft Budget has been made available for community viewing and feedback, which is part of the process adopted in September last year to create a more transparent Budget for 2016-2017.

Mayor Cr Tracy Dobie said placing the Budget on exhibition, holding information sessions, and requesting feedback from residents before the Budget is adopted is a great way for the community to take ownership of the Budget.

"All Councillors have been thoroughly briefed so that they can be brought up to speed on the draft Budget considerations and I now look forward to hearing feedback from the community.

"While everyone within the Council team has been urged to carefully review spending, the need to provide the appropriate level of services expected by the community has also been considered," Mayor Dobie said.

The draft Budget is consistent with the Long Term Financial Forecast and leaves rates at 4%. The draft Budget recognises the ongoing shortfalls in funding from the Federal and State Governments, as well as the need for Council to maintain the renewal of infrastructure and the continued delivery of quality services to urban and rural communities across the region.

The draft Budget includes the Fees and Charges, which have not increased significantly. Council will continue to apply a "user pays" ethos to specific services.

Operating expenses in the Budget have reduced, which reflects the contraction in the size of the work force due to



natural attrition and performance management.

"The good news is that the draft Budget forecasts a small operating surplus as well as a further reduction of Council's debt by \$2 million," the Mayor added.

The draft Capital Works Budget is the largest capital works Budget that will be delivered by Council and recognises the funding success that Council has had across a diversity of funding

Approximately \$23.4 million has been included in the draft Budget for the Capital Works program which features several major projects to be undertaken across the region. Highlights include:

- Stanthorpe Aerodrome safety improvements \$500,000 - the runway will be kept up to the Civil Aviation Safety Authority's standard and should provide another seven years valued service to the community.
- · Warwick Aerodrome safety improvements \$500,000 provide a parallel hangar taxiway with a compliant taxiway strip and improvements to the taxiway strips/shoulders.
- Stanthorpe Flood Early Warning System \$145,000 - upgrade the existing BOM Network to provide an effective early warning system
- Warwick Water Treatment Plan Upgrade \$900,000 - new clarifier to provide system redundancy and improve water quality
- · Bridge replacements: Connells Road Bridge \$1.47 million; Boxes Road Bridge \$1.26 million - both high priority projects, currently monitoring monthly.
- · Old Stanthorpe Road Safety Improvements \$400,000 widening crests and curves
- Nundubbermere Road improvements \$450,000 - rehabilitation and widening
- Sugarloaf Road Mount Tully Road, Stanthorpe \$183,000 road widening with shoulder, signage and delineation improvements.
- · Connolly Dam Road, Warwick \$235,000 sealing unsealed section, delineation improvements, speed reduction.
- Mt Marley Lookout upgrade \$80,000 reseal road and line marking, directional plaque and signage, install covered picnic table.
- · Stanthorpe Civic Centre repairs restoring the Stanthorpe Civic Centre following extensive fire damage.

"Greatly assisting Council's works going forward is the success of Southern Downs Regional Council's submissions to the Federal Government's Black Spot funding for roads program," Mayor Dobie said.

"Approximately \$1.27 million has been secured for 15 projects out of only 89 projects across Queensland, which is a great result for our community," the Mayor added.






