Wattles' Rodeo Washed out But Focused for Footy

While it was great weather for our rural producers the rain on Saturday afternoon resulted in the Wattles 'Warriors' Rugby League Club having to cancel their first major fundraiser of the new season, the 2017 Wattles Annual Rodeo.

The day started in tremendous form with the rodeo organisers Scott & Chantelle Keogh conducting a novel 'Rodeo Clinic' for youngsters aged 6 – 16 that proved so successful with over 60 participants involved. Highly credentialed nationally acclaimed rodeo riders gave their time and expertise providing tuition at the clinic and enlightening the many young rodeo riders of the future.

Another very popular event on the day was a 'Junior Rugby League Coaching Clinic' organised by Wattles A Grade coach Travis Burns.

Travis and many Wattles A Graders & former players, including Matt & Ryan Duggan, Jackson Green, passed on skills and knowledge to a large group of young footy enthusiasts, with New Zealand International Steve Matai a special guest for the event.

Steve drove with his children from Pottsville, NSW for the clinic, returning home after its completion.

Saturday afternoon saw a number of gatherings of Wattles committee members and event organisers to consider the immediate future of the rodeo, most resulting in a hopeful decision of "We will proceed". However, with all erected and in preparation for a mighty evening of rodeo action, at 4.15 pm ahead of the 6.00 pm Rodeo start the event was called off due to the steady wet weather.

Wattles President Glyn Rees said, "while everyone understood there wasn't anything we could do about the weather, it was still a very disappointing outcome for an event that traditionally kick started the Wattles football year financially".



Growing up in the small Central Tablelands of New South Wales township of Wallerawang, a young Ashley McSorley would have hardly dreamed she would be the co-owner of a thriving butcher shop 850 kms to the north in Allora with her fiancé just a half dozen years in to the future.

The former Allora Show Society Showgirl for 2017 met Aaron Vietheer, her betrothed. in mid-2015 and while they have been enjoying life on their forty acres at Berat, in the picturesque Goomburra Valley, their life direction has recently become very focused. Looking Back...

Allora's Past 25 years ago October 1992

Building Demolished

An historic building that was erected in Allora over 100 years ago was demolished this month. Warwick firm Barnes, Archibald and Co. built a new store on the corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets in Allora in 1890. This was taken over by G. P. Barnes & Co in 1893 and was known as the Allora Emporium selling a wide variety of grocery, clothing and hardware lines until it closed in 1939. The building was then occupied by Holmes & Co as a cash grocery store. Jack Marshall opened a garage in the Drayton Street section while George Cunnington operated the Cosy Corner Cafe in Herbert Street. The Stewart family conducted Allora Motors on the site until moving to the Warwick Street corner in the mid 1970's. Bob Whitehouse then moved his chemist shop into the building and this was taken over by Elaine McCormack until it closed in the late 1980's


Allora's Past 75 years ago November 1942

On Wednesday last it was reported to the local police that a man had for a week take up abode in one of Mr. Shannon's paddocks, and from his behaviour it was evident that he was not altogether right in the upper storey. The following morning Constable Chalmers went out and after some trouble arrested the man, who evidently did not care to have an interview with the man in blue. When taken to the lockup he gave his name as Anthony Barry, an ex constable in the Irish Constabulary.
