Book Launch

The president of the Allora and District Historical Society, Lyn Wright, welcomed about 30 interested people to the launch of Brian Hansford's book "William Jubb - From Promise to Disaster" at 2 Jubb Street on Friday. Cr. Sheryl Windle, accompanied by Crs. Yve Stocks and Rod Kelly, spoke, and invited Brian to give an outline of his book. The 2 Jubb Street site was chosen for the launch as it was close to the site where William Jubb set up his blacksmith's shop and possible unlicensed "inn" near the crossing on Goomburra Station in 1845.

A good representation of Jubb Street residents and others with an interest in Allora history attended and found out

about the man after whom the street was named. William Jubb was one of the most enigmatic characters that you would ever come across. On his frequent boat trips between Brisbane and Sydney and return, he travelled as a cabin passenger shared and the dining table with such notaries as Ratcliffe Pring, first Crown Prosecutor in Brisbane and long Queensland time Attorney General: William Butler Tooth, owner of Clifton Station and member

of the Tooth brewing family; Henry Stuart Russell, owner of Cecil Plains Station and author of "The Genesis of Queensland"; and Nehemiah Bartley, merchant and author. Bartlev described Jubb as "a character - illiterate, rough and aggressive in appearance who loved to tackle words of five syllables in his talk with indifferent success.'

On one of his trips to Sydney he fell in with two "ladies of ill repute" at Parramatta. They drugged him, stripped him to the waist and took his wallet (luckily they missed £65 in £5 notes strapped to his thigh). William Jubb spent time in jail for the assault of an employee, faced accusations of cattle stealing and fraud, spent time in Wolston Park asylum, and finally disappeared from public view in the mid 1860's when

he may have carried out a previously stated intention of packing up and going out west

William died at the home of his son-in-law in Brisbane in 1878 at the age of 65. He was buried in the old North Brisbane cemetery, but his was one of the many bodies not exhumed when the site became Lang Park in 1914. The next time that you are at Suncorp Stadium, spare a thought for William Jubb -Allora pioneer.

Author Brian Hansford, his wife Jean, daughter Peta, and quests were treated to an excellent spread put on by the ladies of the Allora and District Historical Society. Thank you to Lyn and John Wright for the use of their home for the occasion.



Swap your showerhead or sprinkler! SDRC launches new water saving scheme

Southern Downs Regional Council has launched its new residential water saving exchange program! Residents can now SWAP their old shower heads or outdoor sprinklers for new, water efficient ones.

Council is calling on all residents to install FREE water efficient showerheads and sprinklers which will help them conserve a precious resource and save on energy costs

Southern Downs Mayor Tracy Dobie said the exchange program is an ideal opportunity and simple way for the community to play their part in water conservation.

Around 40% of household water is used outdoors, while showers account for around 34% of household water usage.

The Southern Downs region moved to medium level water restrictions in June following Queensland State the Government's decision to drought declare the region.

"It is time for everyone to start taking measures to reduce their water usage," Cr Dobie said.

"I am calling on everyone in the community to play their part in being water wise. Implementing water efficient devices is a simply way to save water, help the environment and to save money as well.

"Council's water efficient exchange program is a win for ratepayers and a win for Council as it helps us manage the region's water supply.

"Start taking note of how much water you use so that you can see where savings can be made, and implement those savings yourself."

Swapping your old showerhead or water sprinkler is easy

Complete the showerhead or sprinkler exchange form (available at SDRC Community Contact Centres

or on the SDRC website). To be eligible to take part in the exchange program residents must provide evidence their property is connected to a reticulated (town) water supply with proof of address.

Take your old showerhead or sprinkler and completed form to either the Stanthorpe or Warwick Community Contact Centres where Council will replace it for FREE!

You can simply drop into one of Council's Community Contact Centres and swap over your old sprinkler for a new one but to swap over your showerhead, you'll have to remove it first!

Remove your old showerhead using a spanner - read the step by step instructions. Installing water efficient devices is just one of many simple things that people can do to save water.

SDRC recently extended its water tank rebate scheme and FREE four minute timers are available at Community Contact Centres.

Samsung Australian Diamonds goal keeper Laura Geitz has announced she will call an end to her international career after debuting in 2008 and making 71 appearances for the national team.

The champion defender, Geitz, said the timing was right to call an end to her Diamonds career.

"I have not only had the great honour of representing Australia in the sport I love, but to get the chance to captain the Diamonds to gold at the Commonwealth Games in 2014 is a moment I will cherish for the rest of my life.

"This type of opportunity normally only comes around once in an athletes career, so to get my body right and be in a position to contribute to the Diamonds was a pretty special opportunity.

"I'm a passionate Queenslander and to have the Games on the Gold Coast was incredible. While the gold medal game didn't go our way, it was a fitting event to finish my international career at.

"I'm really looking forward to what the next chapter in my life entails, with more time to focus on work opportunities and my family," Geitz said.

Diamonds head coach, Lisa Alexander, said Laura has been an inspirational leader within the playing group and her presence at camps, on tour and most importantly on court will be missed.

"Laura has been a champion for the Diamonds, the ultimate professional, always setting the bench mark for other players, so they knew exactly what was expected to play at this level.

"Her Diamonds legacy will only grow stronger over the years and no doubt she will continue to have an impact on young players coming up through the ranks.

"Laura is a fantastic ambassador for netball and I personally thank her for the contribution she has made to Diamonds and netball in Australia," Alexander said.
