### POLICE REPORTS

**POLICE IN PRATTEN DRUG RAID** - Police from Allora, Clifton and Leyburn executed a drug and property-related search warrant on a rural residence in Pratten on Friday morning. During the search, which began shortly after 9am, a quantity of cannabis, a number of drug utensils and a small quantity of ammunition was located and seized. Three residents have been served with notices to appear in Warwick Magistrates Court on 19th December. They face a total of ten offences. A 24-years-old female is charged with one count of possessing drugs and her 22-years-old male partner is charge with two counts of possessing drugs, two of possessing drug utensils and one charge of stealing, for an earlier alleged offence committed at Killarney. A 30-years-old male is charged with one count of possessing explosives (ammunition) and one of stealing.

**ALLORA WOMAN CHARGED** - Shortly after 11am on Friday morning, Police executed a drug-related search warrant on a Darling Street, Allora residence. As a result of a number of items located and seized by Police from within the household, a 29 years old Allora woman has been charged with one count of possessing cannabis, one count of possessing drug utensils and one count of possessing things used in a drug crime. The woman is also facing one charge of supplying drugs, as a result of messages Police located on the woman's phone. These messages are alleged to be conversations between the woman and others relating to the sourcing and supplying of cannabis. She will appear Warwick Magistrates Court on 19th December.

**POLICE WARNING ON UNREGISTERED TRAILBIKES** - Allora Police have issued a warning to trailbike riders who may be tempted to take their unregistered bikes onto public roads. Shortly after 3pm on Friday, Allora Officers were performing patrols along the back roads and rural area in between Allora and Clifton when they came across 2 local juveniles riding unregistered trailbikes on a public road. Officer in Charge at Allora, Sergeant Damian Grace said there had been previous complaints by property owners and road users within the area about such activity. Sgt Grace said while the juveniles are to be dealt with under the requirements of the Youth Justice Act, local police are wanting to warn riders, drivers and parents in relation to this activity.

"All vehicle drivers and riders must be licensed appropriately and their vehicles registered regardless of whether it's the main highway or a back-road between properties," Sgt Grace said. "There are significant penalties that can be applied including hefty fines and the forfeiture of the vehicles used, for varying periods of time. There is the potential for non-coverage by insurance companies and very costly legal, civil action if the vehicles and/or their riders are involved in any crash or other incident while doing the wrong thing on the road."

## RACQ celebrates start of fuel price reporting trial

The State's peak motoring body was set to welcome the launch of a new fuel price reporting trial which would, for the first time, deliver Queensland drivers up-to-date prices and give them the opportunity to get a better bang for their buck at the bowser.

Service stations across

Queensland would from Monday be required to report their prices to a State Government appointed aggregator within 30 minutes of a price change at the pump.

RACQ Head of Public Policy Rebecca Michael said the initiative would help put the power back in the hands of motorists and allow them to reward those retailers who offered them the best deal.

"Our members ask for fuel price information and advice more than any other subject and we know Queensland motorists pay some of the highest petrol prices in the country," Dr Michael said.

"That's why we've lobbied so hard to get them access to the latest fuel prices at all retailers – not just those who choose to give us their data.

"We know lower fuel prices start with increased competition and this change will offer greater transparency for motorists."

Dr Michael said the start of the trial would coincide with the launch of the RACQ Fair Fuel Finder app.

"The app is now freely available for download on Apple and Android devices, making it easy to access from any smartphone," she said.

"The trial commenced on Monday and we'll be working hard to get those real-time fuel prices to our app and out to motorists as soon as we can get access to the data, allowing drivers to make an informed choice about where they'll fill their tank."

# Emu Gully Leadership Camp 2019

Our Year 9 students participated in the annual Emu Gully Leadership Camp between 14th – 16th November. As ever, the students were challenged personally and as a group with a number of physical team-building activities.

Working with our sister school, Killarney, the group of 25 students walked blindfolded through the night, crawled slowly through tunnels, discovered that rowing a store-loaded boat was not as easy as it looked and experienced (for a short moment) what the mud on the infamous Kokoda Track may have been like.

Emu Gully, located at Helidon, is not your average outdoor adventure education camp. Using an "ANZAC-theme", all activities are based on one aspect of Australia's war history. This is not to glorify war, but to teach kids that "character" is often formed

when people (or countries) are under pressure. It is easy to be a leader in easy times; it's when times turn hard that leadership really counts!

Year 9 students from both schools undertake the Emu Gully Camp each year as a part of the Leadership Application process. The next step for Allora's students is to make a speech in front of a whole school assembly to outline to their school community why they think they are an eligible applicant for a leadership position.

# Allora Museum prepares for shift

Heavy furniture and items were moved out of the Allora Museum on Tuesday, ahead of the Museum's foundation shift in the new year.

Removalists contracted by the Southern Downs Regional Council (SDRC) were tasked with lifting furniture and exhibits out of the Museum.

The two-storey museum, housed in the former Allora Shire Council Chambers, is set to be shifted one and a half metres onto new foundations in the new year.

The land that the museum currently sits on is badly drained.

The building that

houses the museum was built in 1907 and was the home of the Town of Allora Municipality offices.

In 1915, the Town of Allora was abolished and merged with the southern part of the Shire of Clifton to create the Shire of Allora.

In 1960, the Allora Shire Council moved to a new building at Herbert Street, now home of the Allora Regional Sports Museum.

The former Council building was vacant for a number of years, used for social events, before the Allora and District Historical Society took tenancy in 1990.

## Warwick Hospital staff step up for wellness

Staff members from Warwick Hospital are putting their best foot forward for wellness this November. The group has registered in the free, online program, 10,000 Steps Challenge. The program encourages participants to achieve at least 10,000 steps each day.

"A number of staff from Hanlon Ward have come onboard and registered for the challenge," Hanlon ward Nurse Unit Manager Robyn Cameron said.

"We timed it specifically in the lead up to Christmas to keep our wellness and wellbeing at the front of our minds."

The challenge will be run over six weeks and

will also include weekly information presentations and opportunities for group exercise.

"We've held similar challenges in the past and we've found it to be a great motivator for staff," Ms Cameron said.

"In the first week of the challenge, the team walked a collective 871 kilometres."

Staff have been keeping a record of their steps per day on a tally board located in the ward.

"Our team enjoy having a bit of healthy competition and it's great to work together on improving our wellbeing," Ms Cameron said.

#### Welcome Home

Despite stormy weather, a number of

Allora residents gathered in the Shire Hall in order to welcome home Driver H. E. Whitton, who had been a prisoner of war in Germany for the past 2½ years. The function was arranged by the Allora Welfare Committee and the chairman, Mr. W. J. T. Neale, said that everyone in Allora was glad to see "Herb" Whitton home again. At a function such as this on November 22, 1940, Allora said good-bye to him, and after that he went to the Middle East and was taken prisoner of war on the last lap of the campaign in Greece. Herb arrived on the beach too late to board any of the ships and was rounded up by the Germans.

#### ALLORA STATE SCHOOL

The annual breaking-up ceremony of the Allora State School took place on Friday last. Mr. F. Grayson M.L.A. presented the prizes for the year. Elsie

Holmes (later Muir) won the King Edward Memorial Medal for the girls division and Len Weatherly that for the boys. The latter was also the recipient of a special prize for regular attendance, he having attended school for a period of four and a half years without once absenting himself. During the day a picnic was held, which was largely attended by parents and friends. During the afternoon a sports programme was conducted and enthusiastically enjoyed by the children.

December 1868

#### Queensland Government Gazette 8th December 1868 -

Tenders are called for the building of a Station House, Platform and Goods Shed at Allora, South West Railway, Warwick Extension.

#### Queensland Government Gazette 14th December 1868 -

Tenders are called for the building of a Turn Table and Blow-off Pit, also temporary Engine and Carriage Shed at Allora.

The South West Railway from Toowoomba to Allora was officially opened on the 9th March 1869. (The station at the southern terminus of the line was called Allora not Hendon. It wasn't until September 1873 that the station was called Hendon). The line to Warwick was officially opened on the 10th January 1871, hence the need for a turntable and a temporary engine and carriage shed at Allora until then.


