

# Alara not Allora

For us to know who we are, we must know the origin of our town's name. The pronunciation of the name of our town as ALARA, and not the official name, ALLORA, is a unique piece of our living linguistic history which has been passed from generation to generation. The name ALARA was likely in use from the early 1840s but first appeared in print in February 1857 in an advertisement by Patrick Leslie warning stock owners to stick to the main Warwick-Drayton road and not to trespass on Goomburra Station. The origin of the name is lost in time.

There are at least nine theories on the origin of the name but most fail due to historical inconsistencies. However, there is a common theme for some which indicates the name is derived from the local aboriginal word for swamp and that this swamp was likely located between the racecourse and the showgrounds.

So, this weekend as we celebrate our past, our

pioneers and all those who have contributed to the "Best Little Town of the Downs", let us also celebrate our present generations and those that will be our future. Most of all, lets us all celebrate that we are from ALARA-the heart and soul of the Downs.





# Celebrating 150 years of local Government

Local government was established in Allora following the creation of a municipality on 21st July, 1869.

The first Allora Town Council had a complement of six members - the Mayor, Francis Kates, and five Aldermen, S. Gordon, P. O'Callaghan, A. Shannon, I. Hardwick and J. Gallagher.

The minutes of meetings from the first officially recorded on 18th September, 1869, tell of a decision to rent Yap Yan's cottage for use as a Town Hall, the framing of by-laws, appointment of the first town clerk, and the number of meetings held in the first few weeks.

The first Mayor, Francis Kates, (right) was a flour

miller but owned grazing country at Allora. He became a State politician, representing the electorates of Darling Downs from 1878 to 1881, and Cunningham from 1899 to 1903.

On 23rd January, 1915, Allora Town Council became part of Allora Shire, which was established when a large portion of Clifton Shire was excised.



To mark 50 years of local government, the Council held a Jubilee Banquet in the Protestant Hall where catering was in the hands of the Allora Ladies Repatriation Help Society and music was supplied by the recently-formed Allora Town

Allora Shire Council remained as a local government entity until 1st July, 1994, when the State Government forced the creation of a larger unit, which saw Allora Shire merged with Glengallan and Rosenthal Shires and Warwick City Council to become Warwick Shire Council.










This proved to be a wise decision as many of the contents were affected by moisture and were able to be saved thanks to the Queensland Museum.

The last leader of Allora Shire Council, Jim Deacon, was a member of the Council for 39 years and Chairman for 13 years. He passed away in June this year (2019), just four days short of his 96th birthday.



On 15th March, 2008, Warwick Shire Council was abolished and, along with the adjoining Stanthorpe Shire Council, became what is now Southern Downs Regional Council. As was the case with the previous amalgamation of local councils, this was not a popular move but was enforced by the State Government.

# The many uses of Yap Yan's Cottage

Yap Yan's cottage was an old timber structure which played a significant role in the early days of Allora.

It was on the corner of Drayton and Forde Streets. It is noted for having been the first police station in Allora.

Following a serious threat to the life of John Holmes, licensee of the Dalrymple Hotel, for refusing to serve drinks on a Sunday, the citizens of Allora petitioned the NSW Colonial Secretary in 1862 seeking to have a constable stationed in the town.


Constable Robert Grayson was posted to the town as Acting Sergeant on 1st September, 1864.

He established a police barracks and lock-up in Yap Yan's cottage.


After the Allora Town Council came into being in 1869, Yap Yan's cottage became the first Town

The Council first met in the cottage, which it rented from then owner. Alderman Samuel Gordon, for six months at five shillings per week.

Tenders were called for the erection of a new Town Hall on a site at the corner of Warwick and Forde Streets. The building, still standing and known locally as "The Old Shire Hall', was completed in 1907.

# Schools

Education in Allora began well before the Town Council came into being.

History records that the first lessons in a 'school' environment, were taught in a tent, by Mrs Agness Gwynne, who arrived in Allora with her husband, James, a book keeper, in 1862.

Allora State School was opened on 1st May 1867. William Deacon was the first head teacher.

Local agitation led to the construction of a new school which was officially opened on 22nd June, 1911. An estimated 1200 people attended the opening. The opening occurred on the same day as King George V was crowned and after a school picnic, Coronation medals were given to 400 school children.

The change of name to Allora P-10 State School came about at the end of December, 2008.

Catholic education arrived in Allora with the opening of the first school in 1916. It was staffed by four Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart.

In 1921, a building known as O'Callghan's Hall was moved to the St Patrick's School site and renovated, remaining in use until 1994.

The current St. Patrick's School was opened by Bishop William Morris in 1995.

# Sacred Heart Shrine


The Shrine, in the grounds of St.Patrick's Catholic School was built by the Friends of the Sacred Heart in memory of Allora Catholic men who lost their lives during World War 1.

It was blessed and opened six days after the signing of the Armistice by Archbishop Duhig in the Catholic Church grounds on Sunday 17th November, 1918.

Allora soldiers commemorated at the Shrine are Patrick Collins and Michael Lynam, with plaques either side of the entrance, while inside plaques commemorate Edgar Dunne, James Hughes, James Morrissey and John Warfield. Another plaque inside reads, "In memory of her mother and blessing on her soldier sons: Mrs Lynam".

Mrs Lynam had three sons go to war. A second son, Timothy, was killed on 8 August 1918, but there is no plaque in his memory.

The Shrine was restored and re-opened on St. Patrick's Day in 1999.





# ST PATRICK'S SCHOOL ALLORA

St. Patrick's proud tradition of providing outstanding education to the Allora community is as strong now as it was when the school opened in 1916. For several years, school took place in a simple timber building which had been the first church. In the first year, 108 students were enrolled.

At that time the School was staffed by four Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart. A new convent had been built to accommodate them.

When the school buses began operating in 1957, the option to board was no longer offered at the school

I he second school building was known as
O'Callaghan's Hall, being moved through the town
in 1921 from Drayton Street. It was then renovated
and used as the school until 1994.

The current School was opened in 1995 by Bishop William Morris.

# Churches



#### Methodist Church

The Wesley chapel was built on the site at 34 Herbert Street Allora in 1866. It was used for the first National School until the new school building was completed in 1867.

The Wesley chapel was moved to make way for the new Methodist Church built by H.W.Stay in 1896. In 1907 the Parsonage was built next door. The building is no longer used as a church.

#### St Patrick's Catholic Church

The first St. Patrick's Church was built on the site of the presbytery (since removed) in 1871. The new church was built in 1898 and dedicated by Archbishop R. Dunne.

Allora became a parish in 1911 with Father Phillip Corrigan as its first priest. The Presbytery was built in 1914 and in 1916 Father E. Carroll established St Patrick's School and St Joseph's Convent.

#### St Andrew's Presbyterian Church

The first St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church was built facing Forde Street in 1879. This was moved to

Goomburra when the new church was erected in 1906. The new church served the Presbyterian congregation until the union between the Presbyterian and Methodist Churches in 1971.

The church hall was formerly Deacon & Co's premises and later the Protestant Alliance Hall in Drayton Street.

#### St David's Church

The first Church of England services at 1 Church
Street were held by the Rev. Benjamin Glennie in a cottage occupied by James and Agnes Gwynne in 1862.

The first St. David's church was built in 1868. The new church, designed by architect F.D.G. Stanley was erected by W.G.Gillam in 1888. The stained glass windows were installed between 1982 and 1988.

the grounds.



Her story of Mary Poppins was based on her early childhood in Allora and in particular, her experiences in the house.

Helen's father, Travers Robert Goff, was the local manager of the Australian Joint Stock Bank and the family lived in the house, which was attached to the banking chambers. The building, designed by architect F. D. G. Stanley, was constructed in 1879 and the bank opened in 1880.

The house, set on the original one acre property at 61 Herbert Street, has been faithfully restored by current owners Les and Lorraine Struthers, who purchased the property in 2007. While it is a family home, the Struthers regularly open it for visitors to






# Joseph Sharpe

There have been many notable business people in Allora, one of the most interesting being Joseph Sharpe, who came to the town in 1890 as foreman for the Brisbane firm J. Hack & Co., to build the Queensland National Bank on Drayton Street.

After completing the job Sharpe stayed in Allora and formed a partnership with William Leggatt, trading as Sharpe and Leggatt Building Contractors and Timber Merchants. The firm built many private houses in the town as well as commercial buildings including the railway station and a flour mill for Frances Kates.


After the partnership was dissolved in 1901, Sharpe commenced a sawmill in Kates' former flour mill on land in Forde Street.

Joseph Sharpe owned the first car in Allora and as a leading businessman acquired quite a deal of property.

He bought the block on which a school residence stood when the old School Reserve was sold in 1912, and in 1916 built and opened the Central Hall.

The Star Picture Company was formed in 1919 with six shareholders including Joseph Sharpe and his wife Grace, Harry Reppel and Hubert Deacon.

Sharpe was elected to the first Allora Shire Council in 1915. He died in 1919, aged 57, and was buried in the Allora cemetery.



# Banks


The Australian Joint Stock Bank opened a branch on Herbert Street at Allora in 1880, with the manager's residence attached to the banking chambers. The best known manager, Travers Goff and his wife Margaret, who lived in the residence from 1905 to 1907, were the parents of Helen Lyndon Goff, who wrote 'Mary Poppins' under the name Pamela Lyndon Travers. The bank was incorporated into the Bank of New South Wales during World War 2 but traded only briefly under the new name at Allora before the branch closed in the 1940s.

In 1890, premises were built for the Queensland National Bank on Drayton Street. The National Bank of Australasia acquired the Queensland National Bank in 1948.

The Commercial Banking Company of Sydney (CBC) came to Allora in 1906, and later occupied the town's first brick building, which was erected in 1910. The building remains, with historic leadlight windows intact, at the corner of Warwick and Herbert Streets. In 1981 CBC merged with the National Bank of Australasia, which became the National Australia Bank (NAB) in 1983. NAB moved its local branch to premises on Herbert Street in the 1960s, but it closed that branch in August last year (2018).

Although Allora now has no bank branches, banking facilities are available at the local Post Office.

The town also boasts a branch of the Warwick Credit Union, which has had a presence in Allora since 1992 and today offers a suite of financial options equal to those offered by the "Big Four" banks.



Today, there are three hotels in Allora - the Railway, the Commercial and the Blue Cow - but, as is the case with most Australian country towns, the town has had many hotels over the years.

In 1857 the Dalrymple Hotel was built and apparently it was something of a rough structure. It is reported to have closed in 1867.

In 1864 the Princess of Wales Hotel was opened by Samuel Gordon on Raff Street.

The year 1866 saw the Queen's Arms Hotel erected for Michael Erhart, it later becoming the Royal Hotel which was owned by Patrick Kelley in the 1880s. It was destroyed by fire in 1931. It is now the site of the Blue Cow which has been operated by Jackie Gallagher and her daughter Denise Dalgliesh for more than 30 years.





The single story part of this building was built for John Holmes in 1867 as the Crown Inn.

The Crown Inn was opened in 1867 by John Holmes, later, in 1870s, it became known as the Criterion Hotel and was owned by Patrick Cranitch. That name was changed to the Club Hotel by H. J. Gwynne in 1890. Mr Gwynne added a second storey.

Allora's Commercial Hotel was built in 1892 for Frances Kates and the first licensee was John

The Railway Hotel was built in 1902 by William Leggatt for William Lambley.

The Commercial and Railway Hotels are today owned by Robyn Miles.

The Tattersalls hotel on the corner of Drayton and Forde Street, was built for Patrick Kelley circa 1884.

# Allora Sports Museum

Allora Regional Sports Museum is a local attraction which is growing in stature as each year passes.

The museum had its origin in 1997 when local personality Perry Cronin put forward a plan for an Allora Sporting Hall of Fame to recognise the achievements of many sporting greats from the local area. As the idea caught on, the concept of a sporting museum evolved.

The initial Allora Sporting Hall of Fame inductees were local rugby league legends Max and Brian Phelan, who were inducted at an event in the Allora Community Hall on November 21st, 1997.

A Sports Museum Committee was formed, with Perry Cronin as president, Glyn Rees secretary and Terry Doyle as treasurer, and eventually they

secured a commitment from the former Warwick Shire Council for land at the corner of Herbert and Drayton Streets to be set aside as the site for the venture.

As Perry Cronin continued to amass a collection of sporting memorabilia in a shipping container at his home, a fortunate result of the unpopular amalgamation of local councils was the opportunity in 2010 to lease part of the old Allora Shire Council administration building which led to the creation of the museum and its official opening on February 16th, 2013.

One of Allora's most noted sporting achievers, former international netballer Laura Geitz is the official face of the Allora Regional Sports Museum.

# Railway

The coming of the rail line to Allora was expected to help bring great wealth to the district, although the line from Toowoomba through Cambooya and Clifton actually ended at Hendon and it appears that the only real beneficiaries were the immediate squatters who held large tracts of country around the line.



The opening of the first stage of the Southern Railway took place at Hendon (Allora) on 11th March 1869 and was a grand occasion. Four trains arrived at the station, the last carrying the Governor of Queensland, Samuel Blackall, who performed the official opening.


An extension of the line from Hendon to Warwick was eventually completed in 1871. It was 1897 before a branch line to Allora was provided.

A branch line from Allora to Goomburra was officially opened on 23rd August 1912, with special trains run from Toowoomba and Warwick for the event. The Goomburra extension closed in 1961.

The Hendon to Allora branch line remained open until 1995 when it was "mothballed" by Queensland Rail. The Southern Downs Steam Railway, based at Warwick, harbours hopes of being able to operate a tourist train along the Allora branch line at some future time.

Left: Staff of the Allora railway station in 1923.










# Allora Advertiser

In 1934, The Allora Advertiser, succeeded the Allora Guardian, which had been established in 1880 by McNamara & Barnes. The Guardian was purchased by the Warwick Newspaper Company in 1921 and was printed until 1934.

The Allora Advertiser was started by a group of local businessmen including Hubert Deacon and Frank Donovan, and was produced single-handedly by Michael (Mick)

Con Carling purchased the newspaper after World War 2 ended but in 1948, sold it to Arthur Hammond who employed young apprentice, John Gordon, who would become the proprietor in 1954, running it for more than four decades before selling to Sam and Helen Achilles in 1999.

In 2007 the Achilles sold the Allora Advertiser to Christine Gleeson and her son David who took the roles of editor and printer respectively. Mrs Gleeson moved the newspaper into the digital printing age, producing improved colour resolution.

In October 2018 the Advertiser was acquired by current owners Ted and Mim Rogers, who have advanced it further, publishing a full colour gloss edition every week.

At present the photo shows the CT100 Honda motorcycle used by all Posties in Australia. Now they are bringing in electric tricycles.





"Ideally people should read their meters at a similar time each week to track how much water they are using, and with this information review how they use water if needed."



### Darling Downs locals demand better, safer roads

Darling Downs locals have slammed the state of roads in the region and called for major investment in safety infrastructure, a new RACQ survey has revealed.

As part of its Transport Priorities Survey, Club gave more than Queenslanders a 2000 hypothetical \$100 million and asked how they would spend it to improve their local transport network.

**RACQ** spokesperson Lucinda said Ross the participants in Toowoomba, Lockyer Valley, Western Downs, Southern Downs and Goondiwindi regions would allocate almost two-thirds of their total budget to delivering upgrades on the local and State-controlled road networks.

"Locals are in the best position to identify the problems their roads face and when you put the power in their hands it becomes clear what they value most and where they want to see improvements," Ms Ross said.

"More than percent told us they think

maintenance of the roads in their region isn't up to scratch. About half also feel their roads should be upgraded due to the amount of traffic using them.

"They told us safety upgrades on the Warrego, Gore, Cunningham and New England highways are in need of urgent delivery."

"Sadly regional Queensland is often forgotten about when it comes to funding for these services, but everyone pays rates and taxes, so we urge all governments to consider what's important to the people who contribute to

# Allora's Past 75 years ago July 1944 **Obituary**

Mr. Philip Zeller, well known farmer of "Springvale", Goomburra, died recently in Warwick after an illness of 7 weeks. The late Mr. Zeller came to the district 26 years ago, and acquired the dairying and grazing property known as "Springvale" in 1918. In the intervening years he had, by patient industry and hard work, turned this property into one of the most successful dairying properties on the upper reaches of Dalrymple Creek. Today his son James is carrying on the work. The late Mr. Zeller, who was 68 years of age at the time of his death, spent 18 years in the employ of the Toowoomba Foundry as a furnace man. For 5 years he was

employed at Newcastle learning the tobacco twisting trade in a factory owned by his two brothers. He is survived by his wife, two sons and three daughters- Madeline (nursing sister of Charleville), Bennett (of the R.A.A.F.), Patricia of Warwick, Anthony James, and Rita Margaret. One son died some years ago. The funeral took place in Warwick.


