Isn't it great to have a good laugh? Looks like Wayne Frizzell doesn't want his trophy anymore or does he think he's in the same league as Laura?








Agriculture set to benefit

Minister for Aariculture. Drought and Emergency Management. David Littleproud says agricultural businesses will benefit from the Federal Government's economic stimulus package.

Agriculture, fisheries and forestry will get a boost from a number of support measures in the package designed to support econo-

"The instant write off threshold has been increased from \$30,000 to \$150,000 for businesses

Warwick Show and Rodeo Society made the first move, cancelling the three-day event, which had been scheduled for the coming weekend.

Annual

In a statement, the Society said that the cancellation came under the direction of the Australian Government in regards to COVID-19 and mass gatherings of more than 500 people.

"We appreciate your understanding and patience as our team works through the logistics and issues that come with cancelling an event," the statement said.

The Royal Agrocultural Society of Queensland, which stages the Toowoomba Royal Show, made its decision on Monday.

Toowoomba's iconic event was due to be held from Thursday, 26 March until Saturday, 28 March.

Royal Agricultural Society of Queensland (RASQ) president Shane Charles said the decision was one of the most painful decisions ever taken by the Society.

"The Show impacts on tens of thousands of local citizens as well as retailers, exhibitors. presenters. entertainers and judges from interstate and overseas," Mr Phillips said.

"The cancellation also has significant ramifications for our regional economy given visitors will now not be utilising accommodation venues and restaurants and buying goods in local shops.

"The future of the 2020 Show was foremost in the minds of my committee over the past few weeks and we held our breath waiting for some improved news about







BOER WAR SERVICEM PRIVATES CHARLES RUPERT STEWART, REG. NO.47 AND WALLACE HIGHTON STEWART, REG. NO.78

Brothers. Charles Rupert and Wallace Highton Stewart were the sons of James Stewart, the pound keeper at Allora. James and his wife Margaret Emery were early pioneers, arriving in Allora in 1859.

The brothers would have been original members of the Allora Rifle Corps and the mounted infantry. Their father, James, had donated the land for the formation of the Allora rifle range.

Charles and Wallace gave their names on the first day of enrolment of volunteers to serve in South Africa. They were of similar height and build. Charles was twenty-nine years and Wallace was aged twenty. They became part of the 264 strong 1st Contingent . Most were from Queensland including 11 from the Allora-Clifton district.

The men were sent to Fort Lytton (Brisbane) and within a couple of weeks, the 1st Contingent left Pinkenba wharf, Brisbane bound for Albanv W.A. via Sydney aboard the transport ship "Cornwall". When they arrived in Cape Town, South Africa, the men and horses were loaded on a train to be taken to the Orange Free State. The 1st Contingent was involved in many operations on the veldts of South Africa.

An account of an incident

in which 'Stewart's' horse was badly wounded by shell fire was recorded in a letter home by a fellow trooper. A copy of the letter was included in Len Harvey's book "Letters from the Veldt". The letter dated April, 1900 related how the contingent was heavily engaged in the action where two men were killed, two wounded and five taken prisoner.

Wallace contracted enteric (typhoid) fever. He was invalided back to Brisbane. He was discharged from service on 21st September with 10 week's pay at two-thirds the contingent rate.

The Allora Guardian reported that a large crowd gathered at the Allora railway to welcome home three invalided soldiers from the district. They were met at the railway station and accompanied to the Protestant Hall by the Victoria Institute band, a strong detachment of Allora mounted infantry, school children carrying banners and residents. At the reception, Wallace thanked the people of Allora for the welcome given to himself and his comrades. He was reported as saying, "When the 1st Contingent left, a lot of people from Allora said we were only going for a picnic, but if what we went through was a picnic, I would not care to go to war". After the reception, the soldiers were escorted back to the station where they entrained to Warwick to attend a military ball at the Warwick Town Hall

Charles Stewart returned to Brisbane with the other members of the 1st Contingent at the end of their twelve month term of service in January 1901. He was discharged when the unit was disbanded a week later

Charles qualified for the Queen's South Africa Medal with the relief of Kimberley. Paardeber Driefontein. Johannesburg and Diamond Hill clasps These were the places throughout the Transvaal where the 1st Contingent saw action against the Boers. Wallace's medal only had the clasps of Kimberlev and Driefontein attached.

The returning soldiers were honoured at a social and presentation in the Protestant Hall in March 1901. Each man received a gold medal with an inscription.

Charles rejoined the local Q.M.I. Company. Several members of the unit were chosen as a detachment to proceed to Melbourne with other Queensland troops to take part in the opening of the first Federal Parliament and the Royal visit by Prince

George and his wife Mary in May 1901. Charles was one of three from the company who were in charge of the horses in the horse train. Charles became а

licensed carrier after the Boer War.

Wallace continued to suffer from typhoid fever for many years. He had been awarded a 'pension' of 25 pounds in monthly instalments. After an appeal by the local Australian Light Horse Squadron in 1905. Wallace received a cheque of \$50.00 from the Toowoomba Patriotic Fund. Wallace became а victualler licensed in Toowoomba. Over time he was licensee at the Union, Freemasons, Empire and

the Globe hotels. Wallace Steward died in Toowoomba on the 23rd October 1934 at age fiftyfive years.
