# First Roundabout For Allora

A new roundabout is being installed in the centre of Allora to improve safety and address community concerns.

The Southern Queensland Regional Director for Transport and Main Roads, Bill Lansbury said there had been several crashes at the Forde and Warwick streets intersection in recent years.

"An analysis of the crash history highlighted the need to improve safety at the intersection for both town-based traffic and traffic travelling through the town," Mr Lansbury said.

"Earlier this year we reduced the speed limit for Warwick Street, formally known as Dalrymple Creek Road, from 60km/h to 50km/h.

"The proposed roundabout will further improve safety by introducing consistent give-way controls and moderating traffic speed.

"Motorists from every direction will slow down as they approach the intersection and give way to vehicles on the roundabout.

"This will be a change from traffic on Forde Street having right of way at the intersection.

"The roundabout's central island will be small and easy for motorists to navigate, including heavy vehicles approved for this route."

The Queensland Government is investing about \$400,000 through the Targeted Road Safety

Program to deliver this cost-effective, high-benefit, minor, road safety project.

These meetings are open to anyone and provide an opportunity to talk and listen to others in a non-judgemental, safe environment.



The Melbourne Cup came waltzing for us country folks to see, what a glorious occasion, reflecting history, as so many magic moments came sweeping down the straight, with all those cherished thoroughbreds we brag about and rate.

I took a swig of bubbly as I paused before that Cup, caught a brief glimpse of Flemington, the jockeys climbing up, the tension in the mounting yard, the crowd's wild elation, the rumbling of the hoofbeats, the race that stops the nation.

Great rides emerged to haunt me, and comparisons abound, how we all become an expert when Springtime comes around. I can't go past the thrill of all that cheering, coast to coast, as *Makybe Diva*, three from three, galloped past the post.

Just ask those fearless jockeys, they will gladly give their score, the likes of *Bobby Lewis*, *Harry White*, they both rode four, then *Michelle Payne*, our darling, took the battlers on a spree, while *Ollie* won, God bless him, in his brother's memory.

If headlines love a winner, their *King* had surely landed, with *Light Fingers*, *Galilee*, next year a third, *Red Handed!* *Bart* held that Cup a dozen times, now that earns worthy prose, like The Irish with *Vintage Crop*, The Kiwis' *Empire Rose*.

Old *TJ* and his daughter *Gai*, such stories I decree, have cost this punter dearly, ask the bookies, they love me. We wrestle in the betting ring, when my mates saddle up, for a cold beer in October at Warwick's famous Cup.

It's older than the Melbourne Cup, although by just one year, and nearly as iconic if you ask the folks 'round here. I won't mention characters or horses right this minute, but any book of scandals would feature locals in it.

Hey! Don't get me distracted mate. The Melbourne Cup's here now. Australia's favourite silverware, I feel obliged to bow, I'm getting all excited for November, can't you tell? Perhaps we'll meet at Flemington or down the RSL?

Where those who love *The Sport of Kings* feel appreciated, and yarns we tell get better, the more we're lubricated, while champagne, silks, and omens, and wild dreams worth embracing, stir up the ghosts of Legends past, and once again... *they're racing!*

## Record Health Funding across Region

The 2022-23 State Budget has delivered record funding for Queensland's health and hospital system, including \$1.009 billion for the Darling Downs region, to ensure better, quicker healthcare for all Queenslanders.

Across the state, the record \$22.6 billion Health Budget includes investment in new infrastructure and more beds; a larger workforce; a focus on mental health; and innovative reforms to Queensland's health system.

For the Darling Downs Health and Hospital Service, this includes the new Toowoomba Hospital, a \$1.3 billion investment that will deliver 118 new beds by the second half of 2027.

Minister for Health and Ambulance Services Yvette D'Ath said the State Budget would support strong growth in the health workforce,

committing to employ an extra 9,475 staff in this term of government.

"Investment in our healthcare workforce is vital – they are our greatest asset and the reason Queenslanders continue to receive first-class health care every day," she said.

Ms D'Ath said the budget included \$1.1 billion for the Queensland Ambulance Service, and a focus on improving mental health and wellbeing.

"The investment will help QAS prioritise regional and rural services to ensure accessible healthcare no matter the location, as we recruit more frontline staff and open new facilities," she said.

The QAS will also commission an additional four Mental Health Co-responder services in the Darling Downs, Mackay, Wide Bay, and Sunshine Coast areas.

## Landholders need to be line aware when hazard reduction burning

During the next few months many property owners will be conducting hazard reduction burns to reduce the fuel load to minimise the risk to their properties ahead of fire season

Ergon Energy Work Group Leader Craig Maddy agrees the practice is a great way to reduce the risk of uncontrollable wild-fire - when it's done right.

"In my roles, both with Ergon Energy and also as a volunteer rural fire fighter, I get to see a lot of examples of where fire and electrical assists don't mix," Craig said,

"In just the last few weeks Ergon has had to replace more than a dozen poles that have been damaged or burnt to the ground due to hazard reduction burns where property owners have not taken appropriate measures to protect them."

"This is not just very costly to repair but it can also cut power to entire districts for extended periods while the repairs are undertaken."

Burned power poles can also be a significant safety issue for property owners and the wider community as it's not just the obvious damage to the pole but also the potential for hidden dangers.

A pole that's only partially burnt will be significantly weakened and can snap during high winds or storm activity without warning.

# Burns Leads Wattles to Grand Final Glory



Team captain and coach Travis Burns' Wattles Warriors first grade team served up their club's fifth first grade premiership success since joining the Toowoomba Rugby League in 1966 when they dispatched the Gattton Hawks 51 - 20 at Toowoomba's Clive Berghofer Stadium on Sunday in front of a packed crowd.

While a swansong for the skipper, it was a dream come true for him and his sixteen team mates.

The TRL blue ribbon season decider drew the curtains on the gifted five-eighths rugby league career that included 218 NRL/Super league games.

Burns returned to Wattles in 2018, where his senior league journey began, taking the club's top-grade team to a grand final only to suffer a loss in the dying moments of the game against the Valleys Roosters.

Sunday saw five years of hard work come to fruition, in a sensational performance that also signalled the end of the TRL careers of stalwart forwards Dale Perkins and Ryan Duggan.

The Hawks were first on the Tom Allen Memorial Scoreboard snatching an early 6 - 0 lead after ten

minutes when winger Jayden Williams showed his speed in a runaway try.

The Stillwater Pastoral Company Warriors answered the call with four-pointers by hooker Kai Duggan and fullback Jackson Green to have a 12 - 6 advantage ten minutes prior to half time.

The two sides lived up to their reputation of the top contenders in the TRL, the game looking anyone's coming in to the break.

The Hawks spread their wings in the final five minutes before half time, slick centre Christian Prince touching down closely followed by an intercept try by team skipper Haydan Lipp to take a 16 - 12 lead into the sheds at the crowd.

The mood of the game changed from the first minute of the second stanza when eventual Player of the Match and John McDonald Medallist Matt Duggan combined with Jackson Green for what was a match altering try.

Burns' dressing room speech had made an impression, his team leading 18 - 16, before stacking on another six unanswered touchdowns across the following half hour on their way to an outstanding season climax.

The Hawks tired in the later stages and suffered a lack of ball, compounding their issues trying to come to grips with an up-tempo Wattles outfit who were making every post a winner.

With just seconds remaining on the ground clock and Wattles leading 51 - 16, veteran forward Allan Morris added a little more

respectability to the Hawks total with a hard earned try.

Coach Burns couldn't praise his team enough, indeed all team members throughout the year who contributed to Sunday's result.

"Every player on the field was a 'Best Player'"

Halfback Matt Duggan was Wattles standout performer, along with Jackson Green, while Travis Burns provided sterling support and direction in a team of achievers.

Winger Matthew Christensen was another to shine throughout and earned a try double for his efforts.

Wattles forward pack never took a backward step against a Gattton side with a size advantage.
