#### Wattles Edged Out By "Bears"

Former Brisbane Broncos fullback Tony Duggan ran on for the Wattles "Wartiors" against the Oakey "Bears" on Sunday at Plate Oval, and while he added some class to the "Warriors" arsenal, it wasn't enough to overcome the "Bears" who claimed the premierships points winning 36 " 22. Duggan is a former Wattles junior who won the "Clifton Courier Shield" as Wattles player of the year in 2000. He had a distinguished career with the Toowoomba "Clydesdales" in the Queensland Cup, appearing for the "Broncos" in 2003 before heading to Britain where he became a household name as a star with the Celtic "Crusaders", scoring 101 tries in 88 matches. Of late Duggan has been playing in France, but will manage a brief appearance with the "Warriors" before heading back to Europe.

Duggan ran on in reserve grade also on Sunday, contributing to the Ross Hentschel coached "Warriors" 42 - 20 win, playing alongside younger brother Mark Duggan, who played a starring role in the match.

It was a sad day on Sunday for all associated with Wattles, a minutes silence and tributes presented in memory of Mrs. Nell Quinn and also former club Presidents Dennis Kennedy and Terry Doyle.

Wattles "A" Grade performance could be considered the match that got away, with some glaring defensive lapses presenting Oakey with scoring opportunities. Former Queensland "Rangers" and Under 19 representative Russell McMillan strapped the boots on for the first time this year attempting to help lift Wattles to the victory dais. The "Warriors" let Oakey get away to a 24 - 0 lead after twenty minutes, the "Bears" running in four tries. When winger Jake Smith scored in the 24th minute, it signaled the start of a Wattle's revival. Minutes later centre Matt McCarthy ran onto a Tony Duggan pass launching into a forty metre gallop to the tryline. Classy lead up work by centre Luke Baker, Tony Duggan, back rower Brady Glass and five-eight Tim Hentschel resulting in a Luke Baker try five minutes out from half time.

Oakey led 24 -16 at the break, and while the "Warriors" looked threatening, a try to "Bears" lock Kahl Schemioneck early in the

second stanza reignited the visitors. Wattles front rower John Blaine scored from dummy half in the 58th minute, however Oakey answered with another try and held on for an important

Nick Colthup was Wattles' unsung hero, defending gallantly throughout and making plenty of hard yards with the ball, earning the "Player's Player" award. Brady Glass also shone With a classy all round performance along with Tony Duggan ahd Xavier Manley.

Oakey 36 defeated Wattles 22 (Matt McCarthy, Luke Baker, Jake Smith, John Blaine tries; Brady Glass 3 goals).

Wattles put in impressive performances in the lower grades, the "Railway Hotel, Allora" reserve graders ending a long drought of losses, and the "Allora Foodworks" Under 18's surging back in their match to register a 26 all draw with Oakey. Wattles were on the scoreboard after ten minutes of the reserve grade match, Alex Holohan running on to a Jeff Rees pass for a great try.

Oakey hit back to take the lead, but tries to Brian Wilson, Luke Miller and a gem by Under 18 player Mark Duggan had the "Warriors" in front 20 - 10 at the break. Wattles momentum continued in the second half, tries scored by Jeff Rees, Luke Miller and a brace by Brian Wilson to secure a much deserved victory. Brian Wilson was named "Player's Player", with his outstanding alround effort, including a hat trick of tries. Frontrower Alex Holohan was another to shine alongside Mark Duggan who had already played in the Under 18 match.

Wattles 42 (Brian Wilson 3, Luke Miller 2, Jeffrey Rees, Alex Holihan, Mark Duggan tries; Will Manley 5 goals) defeated

Oakey charged to a 12 - 4 lead by half time in the Under 18 match, Wattles only points an early try to centre Dylan Grady. Two further "Bears" tries after the break saw Wattles trailing 4 - 20, before front rower Carl Gale ran a great angle to crash over to score, jolting the Warriors back into the game. Gale put in a workaholic performance, including two tries to inspire his team mate. Fullback Travis Downie also snatched a try along with winger Ashley Dempsey who was in outstanding form. Dempsey saved some certain tries with his "never say die" defence, a key component in Wattles result, Jordan Henry was another stand out in the match, collecting the "Player's Player" award for his efforts.

Wattles 26 (Carl Gale 2, Travis Downie, Ashley Dempsey, Dylan Grady tries; Jordan Henry 3 goals) drew with Oakey 26. Wattles are on the road next Sunday, taking on the Dalby "Diehards" at Dalby in all grades.


"That's right. Well, I guess you can take one of my calves," says Bud.



#### Looking Back...

#### Allora's Past 100 years ago July 1910 A BUSINESS PURCHASE

Our readers will be interested to learn that Mr. John Scott, who recently disposed of his general business in Allora to Messrs. Lound & Colclough, has purchased the drapery business of Jones & Co., Dalby which is described as the largest purely drapery business on the Downs outside Toowoomba. Mr. Scott, who has been waving a free leg since leaving here, has inspected quite a number of businesses, and the one abovementioned has appealed to his commercial instincts as being the best investment from every point of view. He does not enter into possession for a few weeks, which he will employ in winding up his affairs in Allora. We wish him every success in his new venture.

The firm of Scott & Co. had expanded the general store on the Herbert and Warwick Street's corner after having absorbed the existing firm of Kellett & Symes in 1908. Mr. Isaac Holmes was a partner in the firm of Scott & Co. but following his death in November 1908, the store was carried on by John Scott and Leonard Symes under the name of Scott & Symes. In October 1909, Symes sold his share to John Scott who in turn sold to F. S. Lound and Matthew Colclough in May 1910. John Moorhead bought out the firm of Lound & Colclough in December 1910.

Following the disastrous fire on the Drayton

Street corner in August 1914, Holmes & Co. bought Moorhead's general store. Holmes & Co. traded on the Warwick Street corner until the store burned down in October 1972.

#### Allora's Past 125 years ago July 1885 **Pumpkins and Horses**

Mr. George Essex Evans, Allora correspondent for "The Queenslander", writes in answer to a reader's query on how to teach horses to eat

"I consider pumpkins to be a first-rate winter feed, keeping the bowels open and giving a gloss to the coat. It is very hard to get horses to take to them. I have tried almost every way that I could think of – chopped the pumpkins up and given it with chaff and corn, put salt into the nose bags, boiled it- to no purpose. We had a good supply last winter and wanted to feed our horses on it, but they would not touch it. The only way is to get a horse that has been fed on pumpkins and let him go with your horses. Break the pumpkins on the ground and he will soon teach the others to eat, and when once a horse takes to them, he will become very fond of this feed. For feeding prize stock they are of great value. One boiled pumpkin is worth two uncooked

#### **Pilton Station Centenary** Celebrations -

Things are getting a bit prickly in Pilton. Some of the local men are looking a bit rugged, letting those whiskers grow to see who might have the best looking beard, moustache or mutton chops. If you think you can excel in any of these categories. you had better get cracking. Participants are a bit light on in the moustache and mutton chops section so cultivate those faces fellas. Others are having fun preparing horses to carry pack saddles with some comical results. There are also ladies sewing masterpieces, so they will look the part.

Wondering what's happening in the Pilton district? They're not just trying to keep warm during the cold winter months. There are big celebrations planned for the 4th September!

Lets go back a few years... It was on Thursday, Feb 10, 1910. in the Clifton School of Arts, that Dalgety & Co, in conjunction with Moreheads Limited, undertook the public auction of the remaining 33,514 acres of Pilton Station on behalf of the then owners, Pilton Estates Company Limited.

The area as shown on the sale advertisement was in five subdivisions comprising 176 farming blocks. Blocks adjoining Kings Creek were very popular and sold immediately, and while some areas were further divided, only about 30 blocks remained unsold.

These blocks became available for private sale from all local agents and from Pilton Estates. Within two years all land was taken up.

To mark this historic occasion, the Pilton Station Centenary Celebrations Committee was formed and have been putting in masses of hours getting Celebrations together. It all happens at the Pilton Soldiers Memorial Hall, the first Soldiers Memorial Hall built in Australia. A parade starts the day at 9.30am. This will include a 1910 polo team, Light horsemen and other ridden and pack horses, horse drawn and motorised Vintage vehicles. You might see a 1910 surveyor, a swaggie and maybe even Joseph King and James Sibley, who first settled Pilton, plus lots

Following the parade there are lots of historical displays, re-enactment of a school room with local school children and a home church service, bush dance display, cow milking and sheep shearing the old way and more. Local historian Shirley Murray has been hard at work putting together a history display tracing the ownership of each block. A Tea & Damper morning tea, drinks and Lunch will be available.

The day doesn't finish there. There will be a Pioneer Ball



# Vietnamese noodle and

beef salad

INGREDIENTS

500g beef strips 1 stalk lemon grass, finely chopped

1 small red chilli, seeded and chopped

2 cloves garlic, finely chopped

1 tbsp fish sauce

1 tbsp soy sauce 1 tsp sugar Cooking time: 8 mins
200g mung bean thread

vermicelli 1 tbsp oil

2 spring onions, finely sliced

Preparation time: 10 mins

1 red capsicum, cut into strips 1 punnet cherry tomatoes,

halved 1 tbsp sesame seeds, toasted


2 tbsp mint leaves

#### METHOD

- 1. Place the beef strips in a bowl. Pound together the lemon grass, chilli and garlic in a mortar or blender. Add the fish sauce, soy sauce and sugar, mix well. Combine with the beef strips, marinate for 30 minutes.
- 2. Soak the noodles in boiling water until just tender (about 5 minutes). Drain and snip into manageable lengths with scissors. Add the oil to the beef, mix well.
- 2. Heat the wok, ensure it is hot. Stir-fry the beef strips in 3 batches, reserving each cooked batch to rest in a bowl. Reheat wok between each batch.
- 3. Toss beef together with the noodles, spring onion, capsicum and tomatoes. Scatter with the sesame seeds and mint.

#### TIPS

- Serve with lime wedges if desired.
- Cook meat in small batches, at a maximum of 250g at a time. When you add the meat to the wok, work from the outer side of the wok into the centre where it will be hottest.
- Best beef cuts for stir-frying: Use beef stir-fry strips or prepare your own from rib eye/scotch fillet/tenderloin, sirloin/porterhouse/New York, rump, boneless blade, round, oyster blade or topside steaks.


