





Looking Back...

Drayton Street Museum

The Allora and District Historical Society is investigating the possibility, subject to approval of the Southern Downs Regional Council, of relocating their Drayton Street museum to a site between the Old Shire Hall and the Q. C. W. A. Restrooms in Warwick Street

The building was erected in 1866 as Allora's first court house on the site of the present police station in Raff Street. The builder was local carpenter James Dougall. In 1884 when a new court house was built, the old building was purchased by the local School of Arts Committee for £14 and moved to the Drayton Street site obtained from Mrs. Emily Buxton (nee Gwynne). The Allora School of Arts had been formed in 1873 with a library in the Town Hall in Forde

The Drayton Street building served the Allora community as a library and reading rooms until it was closed in the 1960's. The final meeting of the Allora School of Arts Committee was held on the 26th January 1967. The Allora Boy Scout Troop then took on the lease of the building. When the local Boy Scout Troop folded, the Allora and District Historical Society sub-let the building from the Boy Scouts Association on the 1st July 1970, taking over the lease in November

Difficulties caused by having museum buildings at two separate sites have caused the Historical Society to investigate the possibility of concentrating their buildings on the one site.

Doctor's Death

Dr. Charles Sassadius came to Queensland from Germany in 1865. He spent time at the Pratten goldfields before coming to Allora in late 1866. On the 28th December 1866 he was summonsed by an employee of Pilton Station to attend a man who had a broken leg. In company with another man they set out from Allora at 8 p.m. calling in at Gillam's public house at Spring Creek for two glasses of beer. Dr. Sassidius was seen taking frequent sips from a small bottle that he carried. About 2 1/2 miles past McIntosh's public house at Spring Creek, the doctor tumbled from his horse. The men made him comfortable at the side of the road but Dr. Sassadius passed away later that night.

Dr. Margetts J. P. was called from Warwick to carry out a post mortem and gave evidence at a later inquiry that Dr. Sassadius died from congestion of the brain brought on by the excessive use of intoxicating liquor, combined with the immoderate use of laudanum (an opium derivative).

Dr. Sassadius was buried in the Allora cemetery and his grave marked with a simple wooden cross.

Allora's Past 75 years ago November 1934 Obituary

The death occurred on the 31st October 1934 of Mrs. Janet Cooke at the advanced age of 88 years. Mrs. Cooke arrived in Australia from Scotland with her parents Mr. and Mrs. William Marshall in 1853. She married Mr. Robert Cooke, a well known Allora farmer, in 1868. The Cooke's lived at "Hillside" a few miles to the north west of the town and had extensive property in the Pilton district.

Mrs. Cooke was survived by two sons, Charles and William of Pilton, and three daughters, Mrs. J. Finlay, Mrs. M. Biggar, and Mrs. H. G. Deacon.





PARVOVIRUS by Dr Annabel Robertson

Parvovirus is a virus that can cause a potentially fatal disease in dogs. The virus is shed in faeces and a

susceptible dog has to ingest the virus to become infected. The virus is very stable in the environment and is not killed by regular disinfectants. Due to its stability, the virus is easily transmitted via the hair or feet of infected dogs, contaminated shoes, clothes, and other objects.

Once a dog contracts the disease it usually takes 5-12 days before clinical signs develop. These include depression, anorexia and vomiting. Diarrhea may initially be absent, but most dogs develop a putrid bloody diarrhea within two days.

Parvovirus attacks the rapidly dividing cells in the body. The main organ systems affected are the bone marrow and gastro-intestinal tract. If an unvaccinated bitch is affected whilst she is pregnant the pups can be born with a fatal heart condition.

Treatment is primarily supportive. Fluid therapy and antibiotic, antiemetics and plasma therapy is often used. Unfortunately this can be a potentially fatal disease and prevention is always the best defense.

Puppies require three vaccines for maximum protection against the virus with the first vaccination given between after six weeks of age. While puppies are most susceptible to infection, dogs of any age can be affected and thus should be vaccinated annually.



Glenn & Marg **Hentschel**

How often do you read in the paper or watch the news to hear of another incident of big business swallowing a little enterprise.

Think of the grocery industry with the two giants Coles and Woolworths taking over from the corner store. Or Japanese company National Foods taking over Dairy Farmers Co-operative. which is owned by Australian farmers, or Queensland icon XXXX being purchased by New Zealand brewer Lion Nathan.

But in fact it is small business that makes the Australian economy run. Small business owners are the ones that take the risk, often with little start up and nothing to fall back on.

But fortunately this is a tale of small business success.

Acclaimed business commentator Peter F Drucker once said "Whenever you see a successful business, someone once made a courageous decision," and this is certainly true of Glenn and Marg Hentschel. Without fanfare or strategy they saw a wrong and worked to right it. This is the tale of Glenmar Fuels, who with the support of Allora Clifton and surrounding districts took on big husiness and won

It is very difficult to talk about Glenn Ross Hentschel and Margaret Hope Davis separately, as it seems they have never really been apart. Glenn grew up on a small dairy farm in Mt Marshall just outside Allora with his parents Eric and Leila and brothers Trevor, Russell and Kerry. Marg grew up on the adjoining farm where she lived with parents Dick and Avis and sister Liz.

Both had traditional happy childhoods, both attended Mt Marshall primary school in the same class and later school in Allora and both knew, on some level, that the other would play a special part

At the age of 11 Marg wrote on her ruler "Margaret Davis loves Glenn Hentschel". It took Glenn six more years to work this out but he eventually did and mustered up the courage to ask Marg on a date at the age of 17.

Glenn had always had a passion for machinery and he and his brothers would spend hours pulling cars apart simply to put them back together again. With his knowledge and love of machinery it is not surprising that Glenn eventually went to work for the Main Roads. He was posted west to Mungindi and then on to St George. Most weekends he would make the 435 km trip back to Allora to see Marg. Some time into his posting Marg came to visit and Glenn decided to come back to Allora with her.

Upon his return Glenn did two things which would have a significant impact on his future. Firstly, he asked Marg to marry him and secondly, he took his initial step into the fuel sector when he accepted a job at L.A. May & Co driving fuel tankers to supply the local farmers. He was 20 years old.

In 1978 Glenn and Marg married and set up their family home in George Street in Allora. Their marriage coincided with the demise of the Allora & District Co-operative Society where Marg worked in the accounts department.

Marg then became a full-time homemaker and their first child Gretta was born in 1979 followed by Ross in 1981 and Tim in

Glenn learned a great deal from his boss Lewis May about the importance of good service and honesty in business. In 1985 L.A.May & Co sold the fuel sector of their business to a Toowoomba based firm. Knowing that the level of service would drop, Glenn rejected an offer of employment with the new company and accepted an offer from a Warwick based fuel distributor

Across Australia independent fuel businesses were being absorbed as the amalgamation of fuel distributors powered ahead. The major market players were now reduced to BP, Caltex, Shell and Mobil and Glenn could see that the fuel distribution sector was no longer about service it had simply become a streamlined, profit focused industry. That said, it was not until 1993 that Glenn decided to go it alone and Glenmar Fuels was born.

Glenn recognized that with the big players service was no longer paramount. This, coupled with the uncertainty of the market, prompted Marg and Glenn's decision to purchase a truck and become an independent fuel carrier.

"I had been working in the same industry under different company banners for years. I approached my boss and told him of our decision and said we can either work together or go in competition and I didn't really want to do that" Glenn said.

His boss agreed and Glenmar Fuels became responsible for th BP Fuel run out of Warwick. It was all done over a handshake which is unthinkable today. We agreed to a cartage rate and I agreed to only supply the Allora and Clifton region. Our invoices were printed with the BP logo and our fuel was supplied solely by BP.

"It worked well, and Marg and I had a business of our own" he

By 1998 business was profitable enough to warrant the purchase of a semi-tanker. Justin Barton a very capapble young man was employed to drive the second truck. Due to demand Glenmar Fuels started to buy their own fuel and run their own accounts. The company leased a depot in Clifton to enable them to store fuel to streamline their operation.

Increasingly the couple noticed a deficiency in market supply of fuel. Customers were held over a barrel in terms of price and availability and Marg and Glenn recognized that with the purchase of a tanker they could control the efficiency of distribution to their customers, once again relying on the premise that customers deserved the very best of service

But if they thought that the amalgamations were over were mistaken. Overnight it seemed that oil companies were less in favour of independent distributors. By controlling every element of the supply chain, from production, to storage to distribution, they could increase profit margins and not surprisingly handshake agreement between two businessmen some years before did not stand in their way.

In August 2002 Glenn was called into a meeting in which he was advised his relationship with the company was terminated effective immediately.

"I came home and broke the bad news to Marg. We had just upraded to a Bdouble tanker for \$300000.00 and as of that day we had lost our depot, our supplier and our cartage work. I don"t think it's and understatement to sav

that I was devastated,"Glenn said.

But Marg had far more faith in her husband and encouraged him be continue in the industry.

"We were faced with a choice. Selling everything, for whatever we could get for it and work for someone else of take the oil companies on. I said to Glenn, believe in yourself and believe in what we've created" Marg said.

"It seems ridiculous now. We had two trucks and 300 local customers and we decided to take on the biggest fuel companies. in Australia, "she said,

That night Marg and Glenn drafted a letter to their customers they had been delivering fuel to for over 20 years. The letter outlined what had happended and asked for their support.

And the phone calls of support started coming in. Glenmar Fuels received endorsement from every single customer on their books. Today those same customers remain loyal to the company.

A slander campaign commenced saving that Glenmar Fuels product was substandard and that the company could not possibly run accounts and survive for more than six months. But the oil giants had underestimated a community's loyalty and had forgotten the basic rules of business...that service and honesty will keep a customer coming back

"Glenn had been delivering fuel to the same customers since 1977. We knew so much about their lives just like they knew about us, but we still had doubts about what would happen once we posted out our letter. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to our customers for sticking by us. If they hadn't we certainly would have gone under" Marg said.

"When you invite someone onto your property you have to trust them. Over the years Glenn has put horses back into paddocks,

fixed electric fences, delivered a few calves. There are many funny tales to tell and you would be very surprised what people tell the fuel bloke. Our customers give some very detailed directions to their fuel tank.

Open the front gate, watch that the cattle don't get out, turn left at the chook house and right at the stables and watch that blue dog. Leave the invoice in the vice inside the shed. You can imagine that sort of instruction to someone sitting behind a desk in a call centre in Singapore which some of the large oil companies expect their clients to do" she said.

Glenmar Fuels were no longer bound to a defined area. They obtained access to all the Brisbane Terminals, which made them more price competitive and enabled efficiency of supply and of course, with the support of their customers gave them all the confidence they needed to expand.

Today Glenmar Fuels supplies more than 2000 customers across Southern Queensland and Northern New South Wales.

A company that started with a \$16000 body truck now has 7 trucks worth \$2.7 million.

Glenmar Fuels has been built on the back of honesty, service, integrity and trust. These are not corporate buzz words and if you have any doubt just ask Justin Barton. Eric Standing Greg Riethmuller Brad Eyre Nicholas Cooper and Jamie saal. These men have worked with Glenn and Marg, some for years and they too can confirm the couples care for their clients is genuine. "These men are the backbone of our company, they are not just employees they are mates" Glenn said.

But the story does not stop here because somewhere along this tireless journey to survive and succeed Glenn and Marg raised a family. For those of you that have had the good fortune to meet their three children or even better to be welcomed into this close knit Hentschel group, you can see that Glenmar Fuels is only fraction of what makes this couple unique. Despite obstacles, despite no doubt hard work and long hours, Marg and Glenn have raised a family that choose to spend time together. 'We have grown up with our children and they are not only our kids they are our dearest friends" Marg said. "And now we have two of the greatest little grandchildren to enjoy as well"

Yes this is very definitely a tale of the little guy beating big business. It is a credit to a community that provided support so that a family could survive, it is a credit to a couple who had enough faith in each other to give it a go and a family that have played and stayed together. Remember..."Whenever you see a successful business, someone has made a courageous decision".
